



<u>Directions to the National Equestrian Center:</u> FROM THE EAST (St. Louis) –

Take I-64 (40/61) across the Daniel Boone Bridge (Missouri River). Continue approximately 8 miles to Lake St. Louis Blvd., at the top of the ramp turn left, the Park is about 1.5 miles down on the left hand side OR

Take I-70 West across the Blanchette Bridge (Missouri River), continue approximately 7 miles to the Bryan Road exit. At the top of the ramp, go left. The road winds around (about 4.5 miles) into Hwy N. Turn right onto N and continue SW, crossing over 40/61. Go another one mile and we are on the right hand side. Turn right at Lake St. Louis Blvd., then right into the parking lot. We are behind the Country Store/Hawk Ridge Feed Store.

FROM THE WEST (Wentzville)

Take I-70 Northeast to the 40/61 exit. Go East to the Lake St. Louis Blvd. exit (about 1 mile) At the top of the exit ramp, go left (Southeast). The Park is 1.5 miles down on the left hand side.

FROM THE NORTH (Troy)

If you are on 40/61, then cross over 1-70 and continue as noted above.

FROM I-44, IF YOU ARE PULLING A TRAILER

Take I-44 East to I-270. Take 270 Northwest to I-64 (40/61) and go West toward Wentzville and follow the directions above.

National Equestrian Center Facility Rules to Remember

Move-In begins Thursday, July 12-6:00AM with no early arrival fees charged...

- All trailers must be parked in the camping area or designated trailer parking areas.
 - Manure must be dumped in the approved designated areas.
 - Ponies are not to be bathed anywhere but the wash rack areas.
- Bikes, scooters, golf carts, etc. must be parked on the street or designated parking areas ONLY, not in the entryways to stalling areas or exhibit areas.
 - No practice cones allowed in the make-up area or holding pens.
- All dogs must be on a leash (six foot maximum). Absolutely no dogs are allowed in any of the buildings.
 - No smoking allowed in any of the barns or buildings.

Sportsmanship Policy

Any person acting or inciting or permitting any other to act in a manner contrary to the Rules of the POAC, or in a manner deemed unsportsmanlike, improper, unethical, dishonest, or intemperate, or prejudicial to the best interests of the POAC, shall be reported to the POAC and subject to disciplinary procedures.

Important Order of Go Announcements for all Congress Participants

In all classes requiring an order of go or classes having multiple cuts

Orders and cuts will be posted no later than the morning of that day's
events. If you miss your turn in the "order of go" or your posted cut
without a direct class conflict and without notifying the gate personnel of
this conflict, you may not be allowed to participate in that class.

High Point Awards at the 2013 POAC National Congress

These awards will be presented Saturday evening at the Exhibitors Dinner and Awards Ceremony. If you know you have won a high point award and will not be at the Awards Ceremony, you need to make arrangements for someone to pick up your award for you. If the National POAC has to ship your award(s) to you after the show, you will be billed the postage for shipping. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter. Six High Point Working Saddles will be awarded and have been sponsored by the Mark Hull Family of Michigan.

Important Class and High Point Award Information...

Breeder Classes – Mare and Foal, Get of Sire, and Produce of Dam classes require an additional entry form which must be completed at the show office when entering the class(s). Post entries are permitted in these classes without additional fees. Entry Forms must be completed, paid, and turned in at least two hours before these breeder classes begin.

Equitation and Horsemanship Patterns – Patterns are mandatory for Showmanship, Western Horsemanship, Bareback Horsemanship, and Huntseat Equitation. All Horsemanship and Equitation classes are pattern work only. No call back for rail work. All patterns are included in show

packets.

8&Under Walk/Trot Classes – Youth cannot cross enter in three gaited 8&U pleasure classes and the 8&U walk/trot pleasure classes. The 8&U walk/trot pleasure classes do not count for High Point Awards.

Hunter In Hand – Does not count toward high points at this show – refer to POAC Official Handbook for other classes that do not count toward the various high point awards.

The following High Point and Specialty Awards will be presented. Be sure that you read the current POAC Official Handbook for details of each award before the show begins and clarify any questions with the Show Office prior to the show.

Overall High Point Pony Awards (Stake Awards) – High Point Small Mare, High Point Medium Mare, High Point Large Mare, High Point Small Gelding, High Point Medium Gelding, High Point Large Gelding, High Point Small Stallion, High Point Medium Stallion, and High Point Large Stallion. No halter class participation is required. Only ponies that are four years and older are eligible to compete for these High Point Stakes Awards.

Overall High Point Mare – Little White Mare Traveling Trophy Award – Sponsored by the Andreas Family, IL

Overall High Point Stallion – The Gene and Carolyn Salisbury Award – Picture Plaque Award

Overall High Point Gelding – In honor of "Bobby Sox Plaudit – Sponsored by the Shingleton Family Award, IN

High Point Rider Award (Multiple Pony) – Anyone wanting to compete for the High Point Rider Awards 18&U must complete and submit a High Point Rider Designation Form at check in before show begins. No new back numbers issued once show begins can be included in High Point Rider point tabulations.

High Point One Pony/One Rider Awards – Six placings will be awarded in the following age groups: 8&U Boy, 8&U Girl, 9-12 Boy, 9-12 Girl, 13-18 Boy, and 13-18 Girl.

High Point Leadline Awards – Sue Daig Memorial Awards – Given to Boy & Girl – Leadline Eq. & Leadline Costume.

High Point Timed Events Pony – Awards given in 8&U, 9-12, and 13-18 age groups.

High Point Equitation Awards – Sponsored by Dahl/Cleary Families of Wisconsin – Awards given in 8&U Boy, 8&U Girl, 9-12 Boy, 9-12 Girl, 13-18 Boy, and 13-18 Girl age groups.

High Point Junior Pony Award – Junior W. Pleasure, Junior HUS, Junior Trail, and Junior Reining included.

High Point JPFC Award – Broken into 2-year-old and 3-4 year old divisions. JPFC W. Pleasure, JPFC HUS, JPFC Trail included

High Point 19 & Over Award – 19&O W. Pleasure, 19&O HUS, 19&O Trail, 19&O Reining – Must complete a Show Points Designation Form at check-in if same pony is being shown in same event with a youth rider for points to count.


2013 POAC National Congress Show MATURITY ENTRY FORM

- A. The Versatility Competition is shown in four divisions and each will be judged in accordance with the current POAC Rules. Order of events: Open Jumping, Hunter Under Saddle, Western Pleasure, and Cloverleaf Barrels.
- B. Judges will select ten (10) placings in each event. Ribbons will be awarded at the conclusion of each event.
- C. Every entry must show in all four (4) events and may have one rider only for each event. No rider may show more than one pony. Entry Forms must be complete and with the entry fee before it will be accepted at the Show Office. No changes will be accepted once entered except for injury or illness. Riders must be 18 & Under.
- D. Points will be awarded based on placings in each event. A point scale of 24-15 will be used to tabulate results. The winner of the Versatility Competition will be the pony accumulating the most points in the four events combined. Lower placings will be similarly determined. In the event of a tie, the following tie breakers will be used in this order, until the tie is broken: 1) Pony placing in the most events 2) Pony winning the most events, then most seconds, etc. 3) Entry with the fastest Cloverleaf Barrels time.
- E. All necessary tack or appointment changes will be made in the arena. Two assistants will be permitted in the show ring for tack changes. All changes must be made within the five minute interval between events, or the entry will be eliminated. No pony will be permitted to leave the ring after the event starts without the permission of the Judge or the Show Committee.
- F. There will be a meeting prior to the Versatility Competition where all rules and procedures will be reviewed. Running orders will also be determined by a draw for Jumping and Barrels. The meeting time will be determined by the Show Committee and all participants will be notified of time and place.
- G. Exhibitors are cautioned to guard their tack and appointments against loss and theft. The Show Committee cannot be responsible for lost or stolen items.
- H. The Versatility Competition will be limited to twenty-five (25) entries. The first 25 entries that are submitted with all information completed and proper fee attached will be accepted. Any entries received after the class is filled will be refunded.

Held in conjunction with the POAC National Congress Show

About the National POAC Judging contest

- This judging contest will be held every year in conjunction with the POAC National Congress Show.
- This contest is open to 4-H, FFA, and POA Judging Teams. All contestants judge a schedule of three halter and three performance classes. In each class, four horses must be evaluated, compared, and placed objectively. These placings are then scored against an ideal placing determined by a panel of carded judges.
- Contestants must also give a well-articulated defense for their placement of one halter class and one performance class. To give these oral reasons, the young judges must learn to think, organize and speak publicly. They are judged on organization, relevancy, accuracy, terminology and presentation.
- The team and individual winners of this contest are those who have the highest combined scores for the class placings and oral reasons. Trophies and ribbons will be awarded.

How the Judging Contest Works

Placing Classes

- Contestants judge: three in-hand and three performance classes. The horses used in the contest are donated by POA International competitors who exhibit these horses at the show.
- In each class, four horses are evaluated, compared, and placed. These placings are then scored against an ideal placing determined by a panel of respected guest judges.
- Each class has a maximum of 50 points. Points are deducted from the contestants' scores if they place the class differently than the judges.

Oral Reasons

- Contestants must also give a well-articulated defense for their placement of one halter classes and one performance classes. To give these oral reasons the young judges must learn to think, organize and speak in a structured environment. They are judged on organization, relevancy, accuracy, terminology and presentation.
 - The maximum score for oral reasons is 50 points.

Who Wins?

• The overall winners of this national contest are those teams and individuals who have the highest combined scores for the class placings and the oral reasons. Other winners are teams and individuals who have the highest scores for performance, halter, and oral reasons respectively.

What's at Stake?

- Winners are awarded trophies and ribbons.
- This competition offers more than just prizes. Placing classes and defending one's judgment teaches objectivity, honesty and fairness, and it encourages the development of skills that can be carried proudly through an individual's life.

POAC JUDGING CONTEST

This contest abides by the National Horse Judging Team Coaches Association (NHJTCA) judging contest rules. It is held in conjunction with the International Championship POA Show. Teams will have the chance to evaluate the conformation and quality of some of the best POAs. Awards will be available to all winning participants.

HORSE JUDGING CONTEST JUNIOR DIVISION ELIGIBILITY

Junior divisions to be 4-H and FFA teams or POA STATE teams.

- 1. Age. This competition is open to youth who have not passed their 19th birthday prior to January 1st of the current year and who have not participated in a collegiate horse judging contest. Junior members can be enrolled in any year of college as long as they have not competed on a college judging team and are eligible in all other ways. Contestants must be bona fide members of a state 4-H or state FFA team or be a member of a team sponsored by an State POA Member Organization.
- 2. Team Entry. Each state is invited to enter 4-H and FFA teams, and these teams must be recognized by their respective state's 4-H or FFA office. POA Member Organizations are invited to sponsor and enter teams. A team may be composed of three or four contestants. If four contestants are entered as a team, the three highest scores will constitute that team's total score. Team coaches will verify the eligibility of each contestant as to age, school status, and membership in their respective organization at time of entry.

HORSE JUDGING CONTEST GENERAL RULES

- 1. Entry forms with \$100/\$25 entry fee must be postmarked June 25, 2012. Post entry fee, \$125/\$30. Entries may be made up to the start of the contest on July 13, 2012.
 - 2. All registered contestants will report to the contest location in Arena B promptly at 6:00 p.m. on July 13, 1012.
- 3. Contestants will be assigned to groups and will remain with their respective groups throughout the contest. During registration, each team must hand in the provided registration card or envelope. The placing cards will be the standard 4-H and FFA judging cards, which list all 24 placings for a class. Detailed instructions will be given on the use of these cards during the registration period.
- 4. In case of ties, the team or individual having the highest score on combined reasons will be listed first. If the tie still exists, the team or individual having the highest Reasons Score overall will be listed first. Additional tie-breaking classes will be designated by the official judges before scores are tabulated.
- 5. Official judges will place the classes while the contestants are judging. When all cards have been turned in for tabulation and all oral reasons have been presented by the contestants, the official judges will explain their placing of each class.
- 6. A judging contest is an examination, and it should be treated as such. Contestants will not be allowed to use or refer to any printed material at any time during the contest. The contestants are allowed to have only blank paper in their notebooks, clipboards, pads, etc. Any violation of this rule may result in immediate disqualification.
- 7. During the entire judging contest, contestants may not wear pins, badges, lettering, or any article of clothing that will reveal their identity or will identify the state or club that they represent. Matching blazers, articles of clothing, etc., are permissible. No hats will be allowed during this judging contest. Neatness and appropriateness of attire will be taken into consideration.
 - 8. Contestants are not permitted to use notes while giving oral reasons.
- 9. While the contest is in progress, there shall be no conversation or signals between contestants, or between contestants and other individuals. The contestant should direct any questions to their group leaders.
- 10. Classes will be judged according to standards set forth by the current POAC rules for the Pony of Americas. 6 classes will be judged: 3 Halter and 3 performance. Horses will not be handled by contestants. Any class from the POAC Rulebook may be considered for this contest. In the Halter, all horses are to be judged as sound of limb, mouth, and for breeding. In performance classes, horses are to be judged as they appear (all tack is to be considered legal).
- 11. Each class will consist of four POAs. Fifteen minutes will be allowed for judging non-reasons classes and 17 minutes for reasons classes. Contestants will be notified one minute before the time is up. When the final time is called, the contestants will hand their completedscorecard to their group leader immediately. Oral reasons will be required in one halter and one performance class. Two minutes will be allowed to give oral reasons.
- 12. Members of the top teams will be awarded ribbons. Various awards, as well as ribbons will be awarded to top performance, top halter, overall and team.
- 13. All contestants will have the opportunity to watch the International Championship POA Show and visit with the exhibitors. Winners must be present to receive their awards at the afternoon presentation of Awards.
