2017 Colt Starting!

The Show Me Equine Summit Colt Starting Challenge is a unique event designed to show the general public the way that young horses are trained to be willingly handled and ridden. The stars of the event are Young American Quarter Horses who have not been trained beyond the ability to lead at this point.

The contestants will have 3 1-hour periods to work with the colts over a two day period. At the end of that time each trainer will be judged on their ability to complete a required set of maneuvers: walk, trot, lope, stop and back. Each contestant will also be given a chance to showcase additional things they have taught their horse in a "freestyle" portion of the event. The freestyle portion will be judged by the audience and will constitute a portion of the contestant's overall score.

participating in the colt division of the Ultimate Horseman's Challenge (UHCA),


competing in the Extreme Mustang Makeovers, competing in four and placing
